Directions

Frankfurt Main Train Station

From the Frankfurter Hauptbahnhof take the U5 in the direction "Preungesheim" until the stop called "Gießener Straße". On Marbachweg turn right onto Gießener Straße, then turn left onto Wetzlarer Straße where you will find the entrace marked "Employee Entrance".

Frankfurt Airport

Take public transportation to the Frankfurt Main Train Station, then follow the aforementioned directions.
